Care and Maintenance

Congratulations on the purchase of your New Bathroom!

The following instructions have been compiled so that you may have many years of enjoyable use and hassle-free maintenance. Cleaning instructions (in addition to the manufacturer instructions) are for all products installed and will help keep your bath looking as good, new & clean as today!

General Cleaning Instructions:

For normal everyday cleaning, we suggest the use of a mild soap and water with a soft washcloth. Do not use scouring pads or abrasive cleaners, as they will dull the surface. Should you wish to use a product not listed below, test on small area in a corner before applying to the entire surface. Always review individual cleaner's instructions. Always rinse thoroughly after cleaning.

Recommended Cleaner:

Glass Plus, Dish washing soaps: Dawn, Joy, or Ivory, Diluted Pine Sol, Simple Green, Bathroom Duck, Bon Ami, Diluted Spic & Span, Fantastik Heavy Duty, Formula 409, Windex Original, Soft Scrub-Gel with Bleach, Orange Glow Wood Funiture Cleaner, Murphy Oil Soap, Agua Mix Granite Cleaner, Bona Wood Floor Cleaner, Gel Gloss, any type of hard water or calcium remover such as CRL. There is no need to use abrasive cleaners, as they will dull the gloss over a period of years. In extreme cases where the recommended cleaners do not work, use mild abrasive cleaners such as Soft Scrub or Liquid Comet.

Do Not Use:

Ammonia or Cleaners containing Ammonia, Bleach, Acetone, Lysol Disinfectant, Fingernail Polish Remover, Lestoil, Dow Disinfectant Cleaners, Kaboom, aerosol cleaners, Harsh Abrasives and/or -Comet/Ajax, Steel wool / Wire Brushes, Mats with suction cups or adhesives, Tape, Dye's/inks, Clean Shower. * Use of the above products will cause a dull surface and/or an easily recognizable chemical crack. This will void your product warranty.

Drain Cleaners

Caution: Liquid drain cleaners are recommended over powders and/or crystal. However, when using liquid drain cleaning agents, bail the standing water out of the bathtub and remove the drain plug. Use a funnel to prevent spills and apply the chemicals directly down the drain. Always make certain that chemicals do not come in contact with the new surface. Use drain cleaners sparingly so that they do not boil out and attack the new surface.

Remove Light Scratch, Abrasions, Etc.

Should you accidentally use an abrasive cleaner or incur a minor scratch on your new acrylic product, it may be restored to its original glossiness. You can do this by using a liquid acrylic car wax. Should you wish to use any other polishing waxes or compounds, please test in a corner area of the skirt that is not highly visible.

Please Note

When using a wax to clean and restore a product that has been poorly maintained, wax will generally leave a slick surface. While this is very beneficial and recommended for wall systems, it is not desirable on the slip resistant surface of a bathtub or showerpan bottom. We have found that Mirror Glaze #17 does not appear to create as slick a surface. Mirror Glaze is generally available at a local automotive
